1 Overview

A Background

The USDA Office of Tribal Relations and IAC entered into a cooperative agreement to assist Native American farmers and ranchers with the technical assistance needed to better understand FSA loan making and servicing programs. In addition to providing farm management and financial planning, IAC is assisting Native American farmers and ranchers with completing loan making and servicing applications, other program forms, preparing farm narratives, and any other aspect of FLP program requirements.

B County Office Responsibilities

The County Office will provide Exhibit 1 to Native American farmers and ranchers who inquire about or require technical assistance. Technical assistance includes help in completing the forms needed for a loan making or servicing application. Other sources of technical assistance available to all customers (such as Extension Service and Community Colleges) will continue to be provided to Native American ranchers and farmers.

Technical Assistance Provided to FSA Farmers and Ranchers by IAC

The Intertribal Agriculture Council is a non-profit corporation, founded in 1987. Its membership consists of federally recognized Tribes, including the Alaska Native villages.

After an in-depth study of the Indian Agricultural sector, Congress mandated the creation of an entity with the sole charge of working to ensure the Indian use of Indian resources. The Intertribal Agriculture Council has been actively working towards this goal ever since.

The Office of Tribal Relations is responsible for government-to-government relations between USDA and tribal governments.

Through a collaboration between the U.S. Department of Agriculture Office of Tribal Relations and the Intertribal Agriculture Council, Technical Assistance Centers were established to increase access and use of USDA programs and services by Indian producers and Tribes.

IAC technical assistance providers are trained to guide farmers and ranchers through the regulations and processes of Federal Agencies. The Network can assist with everything from financial planning, to crop insurance, to conservation practices.

The attached list of IAC technical assistance providers will provide no charge assistance in completing loan servicing packages or loan application package for the Farm Service Agency. Please feel free to contact your local FSA Office or 1 of following IAC representatives for help in completing an application for a loan or for loan servicing.
