## Federal Emergency Management Agency Designates 4 Ohio Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

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#### Adams, Jay, Randolph and Wayne Counties in Indiana are Contiguous Counties

**INDIANAPOLIS, May 16, 2024** - This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Ohio

**Triggering Disaster:** Tornadoes that occurred on March 14, 2024.

**Application Deadline**: January 2, 2025

<u>Primary Counties Eligible:</u> Auglaize, Crawford, Darke, Delaware, Hancock, Licking, Logan, Mercer, Miami, Richland and Union

## **Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**

**Ohio:** Allen, Ashland, Champaign, Clark, Coshocton, Fairfield, Franklin, Hardin, Henry, Huron, Knox, Madison, Marion, Montgomery, Morrow, Muskingum, Perry, Preble, Putnam, Seneca, Shelby, Van Wert, Wood and Wyandot.

Indiana: Adams, Jay, Randolph and Wayne
