USDA Announces Availability of Low-Interest Physical Loss Loans for Producers in Dakota, Scott, and Washington and Surrounding Counties Affected by Excessive Rain and Flooding

News Release | Minnesota | June 17, 2024

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Physical loss loans through the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) can help producers repair or replace damaged or destroyed physical property essential to the success of the agricultural operation, including livestock losses. Examples of property commonly affected include essential farm buildings, fixtures to real estate, equipment, livestock, perennial crops, fruit and nut bearing trees, and harvested or stored crops and hay.

Impacted Area: Minnesota

Triggering Disaster: Excessive Rain, Flash Flooding, and Flooding on May 21, 2024

Application Deadline: February 17, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Dakota, Scott, Washington

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Minnesota: Anoka, Carver, Chisago, Goodhue, Hennepin, Le Sueur, Ramsey, Rice, Sibley

Wisconsin: Pierce, Polk, St. Croix
