USDA Announces Availability of Low-Interest Physical Loss Emergency
Loans for Producers in 10 Primary Ohio Counties Affected by Tornado that
occurred on March 14, 2024, with Additional Counties Eligible as
Contiguous Counties

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Ohio agricultural producers in Auglaize, Crawford, Darke, Delaware, Licking, Logan, Mercer, Miami, Seneca and Union Counties who lost property due to recent natural disasters are eligible for physical loss loans from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA).

FSA is offering these <u>low-interest emergency loans</u> to producers with a qualifying loss. Approval is limited to applicants who suffered severe physical losses only, including the loss of buildings and livestock. The deadline for producers in designated primary and contiguous counties to apply for loans for physical losses is February 14, 2025.

Impacted Area: Ohio and Indiana

Triggering Disaster: A tornado that occurred on March 14, 2024.

Application Deadline: February 14, 2025.

Primary Counties Eligible:

Ohio – Auglaize, Crawford, Darke, Delaware, Licking, Logan, Mercer, Miami, Seneca, and Union Counties.

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Ohio – Allen, Champaign, Clark, Coshocton, Fairfield, Franklin, Hancock, Hardin, Huron, Knox, Madison, Marion, Montgomery, Morrow, Muskingum, Perry, Preble, Richland, Sandusky, Shelby, Van Wert, Wood, and Wyandot Counties.

Indiana - Adams, Jay, Randolph and Wayne Counties.

Physical loss loans can help producers repair or replace damaged or destroyed physical property essential to the success of the agricultural operation, including livestock losses. Examples of property commonly affected include essential farm buildings, fixtures to real estate, equipment, livestock, perennial crops, fruit and nut bearing trees, and harvested or stored crops and hay.
