USDA Designates 3 Montana Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas for Drought

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>, these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for eight or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Montana

Triggering Disaster: Drought Beginning 08/27/2024

Application Deadline: 05/05/2025

Primary Counties Eligible:

Montana - Carter, Roosevelt and Sheridan

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

State: Montana – Custer, Daniels, Fallon, McCone, Powder River, Richland and Valley

Additional State:

North Dakota - Divide, McKenzie and Williams

South Dakota – Butte and Harding

Wyoming - Crook
