

USDA Designates 3 Georgia Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas for Drought

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>, these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for eight or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Georgia, Tennessee, Alabama

Triggering Disaster: Drought

Beginning Date - Incident Period: September 17, 2024

Application Deadline: May 23, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Georgia: Catoosa, Dade, Walker

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Georgia: Chattooga, Floyd, Gordon, Whitfield

Alabama: DeKalb, Jackson

Tennessee: Hamilton, Marion
