USDA Designates 3 Nevada Primary Counties and 1 Arizona County as Contiguous Natural Disaster Area for Drought

Emergency Designation | Arizona | December 09, 2024

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through emergency loans. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>, these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for eight or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Nevada

Triggering Disaster: Drought (Fast-Track) that occurred on 10/08/2024

Application Deadline: 08/11/2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Clark, Lincoln, Nye

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Nevada: Churchill, Esmeralda, Eureka, Lander, Mineral, White Pine

Arizona: Mohave

California: Inyo, San Bernadino

Utah: Beaver, Iron, Millard, Washington
