# USDA Designates Ten Wyoming Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas for Drought

Emergency Designation | Montana | March 27, 2025

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>, these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for eight or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

**Triggering Disaster:** 3/25/2025 **Application Deadline**: 11/25/2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Albany, Big Horn, Carbon, Fremont, Hot Springs, Lincoln, Natrona, Park,

Sublette and Washakie

#### **Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**

Wyoming: Converse, Johnson, Laramie, Platte, Sheridan, Sweetwater, Teton and Uinta

**Colorado:** Jackson, Larimer, Moffat and Routt **Idaho:** Bear Lake, Bonneville and Caribou **Montana:** Big Horn, Carbon, Gallatin and Park
