Federal Emergency Management Agency Designates 8 Oklahoma Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas Due to Severe Storms, Straight-line Winds, Tornadoes, and Flooding

Emergency Designation | Oklahoma | April 01, 2025

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This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Arkansas, Oklahoma, and Texas

Triggering Disaster: Straight-line Winds, Severe Storms, Tornadoes, and Flooding

Application Deadline: November 18, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Adair, Garvin, Jefferson, Lincoln, Okfuskee, Oklahoma, Stephens, and Washita

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Arkansas: Benton, Crawford, and Washington

Oklahoma: Beckham, Caddo, Canadian, Carter, Cherokee, Cleveland, Comanche, Cotton, Creek, Custer, Delaware, Grady, Hughes, Kingfisher, Kiowa, Logan, Love, McClain, McIntosh, Murray, Okmulgee, Payne, Pontotoc, Pottawatomie, Seminole, and Sequoyah

Texas: Clay and Montague
