USDA Designates 1 Kentucky County as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

Emergency Designation | Indiana | April 11, 2025

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Perry County in Indiana Eligible as Contiguous County

INDIANAPOLIS. April 11, 2025 - This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Kentucky

Triggering Disaster: Excessive rain, flash floods and high winds that occurred July 30, 2024, through August 2, 2024.

Application Deadline: December 1, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Breckinridge

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Kentucky: Grayson, Hancock, Hardin, Meade and Ohio

Indiana: Perry
