USDA Designates Three Texas Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

State: Texas

Triggering Disaster: Winter storm, blizzard, snow, ice and high winds that occurred Feb. 10 - Feb. 19, 2021

Application Deadline: March 9, 2022

Primary Counties Eligible: McCulloch, Mitchell and Scurry

Contiguous Counties also Eligible: Borden, Brown, Coke, Coleman, Concho, Fisher, Garza, Howard, Kent, Mason, Menard, Nolan, San Saba and Sterling
