## USDA Designates 12 Michigan Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

**Emergency Designation | October 27, 2021**

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

**Impacted Area:** Michigan

**Triggering Disaster #1:** Frost and freeze that occurred April 2 through June 25, 2021

**Application Deadline:** June 20, 2022

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Allegan, Berrien, Cass, Cheboygan, Ottawa and Presque Isle

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**

**Application Deadline:** June 20, 2022

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Chippewa, Huron, Luce and Mackinac

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:** Alger, Cheboygan, Emmet, Sanilac, Schoolcraft and Tuscola

**Triggering Disaster #3:** Excessive rain that occurred from June 1 through July 10, 2021

**Application Deadline:** June 20, 2022

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Branch and Huron

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**
