USDA Designates Tippecanoe County, Indiana, as a Primary Natural Disaster Area

***Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:
Benton, Carroll, Clinton, Fountain, Montgomery, Warren and White***

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Indiana

Triggering Disaster: Frost and freeze that occurred from April 20 through April 22, 2021

Application Deadline: July 5, 2022

Primary County Eligible: Tippecanoe

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Benton, Carroll, Clinton, Fountain, Montgomery, Warren and White
