



USDA Designates Henry County, Ohio, as a Primary Natural Disaster Area

COLUMBUS, OHIO – Feb. 23, 2022 – This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Ohio

Triggering Disaster: Excessive rainfall that occurred from Oct. 1 through Oct. 31, 2021.

Application Deadline: Oct. 11, 2022

Primary County Eligible: Henry
