

USDA Designates 12 Nebraska Counties as Disasters Due to Drought

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

According to the [U.S. Drought Monitor](#), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Nebraska

Triggering Disaster: Drought

Application Deadline: Dec. 19, 2022

Primary Counties Eligible: Blaine, Dundy, Hayes, Hitchcock, Knox, Loup, Madison, Merrick, Nance, Pierce, Platte and Red Willow

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Nebraska: Antelope, Boone, Boyd, Brown, Butler, Cedar, Chase, Cherry, Colfax, Custer, Frontier, Furnas, Garfield, Greeley, Hall, Hamilton, Holt, Howard, Lincoln, Logan, Perkins, Polk, Rock, Stanton, Thomas and Wayne.

Colorado: Yuma

Kansas: Cheyenne, Decatur and Rawlins

South Dakota: Bon Homme, Charles Mix and Yankton
