Availability of Low-Interest Emergency Loans for Producers Affected by Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza Quarantine

Emergency Designation | July 12, 2022

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The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) extends muchneeded emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters and, in this case, quarantines
through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various needs including the
replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation
or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security
available and repayment ability.

<u>Triggering Disaster Event</u>: March 25, 2022 and continuing due to damage and losses caused by the Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza Quarantine imposed by the Minnesota Board of Animal Health.
