This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

According to the [U.S. Drought Monitor](#), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Kansas

Triggering Disaster: Drought

Application Deadline: June 12, 2023

Primary Counties Eligible: Anderson, Coffey, Johnson, Linn, Lyon and Wyandotte

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Kansas: Allen, Bourbon, Chase, Douglas, Franklin, Greenwood, Leavenworth, Miami, Morris, Osage, Wabaunsee and Woodson

Missouri: Bates, Cass, Clay, Jackson, Platte and Vernon
