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## **USDA Designates Brown and Clermont Counties in Ohio, as Primary Natural Disaster Areas**

**News Release | Ohio | November 10, 2022**

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**WASHINGTON, Nov. 4, 2022** – This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

**Impacted Area:** Ohio

**Triggering Disaster:** Excessive rainfall that occurred from May 1 through June 16, 2022.

**Application Deadline:** May 29, 2023

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Brown and Clermont

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**

**In Ohio:** Adams, Clinton, Hamilton, Highland and Warren

**In Kentucky:** Bracken, Campbell, Mason and Pendleton
