

USDA Issues Quarantine Designation for Maui County, Hawaii Emergency Designation | December 05, 2022

Low-Interest Emergency Loans Available to Producers Affected by Bovine Tuberculosis

This emergency designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit, through <u>emergency loans</u>, to producers impacted by an animal quarantine designation. Emergency loans can be used to meet various needs including the replacement of essential items such as livestock, equipment, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Hawaii

Triggering Disaster: Quarantine on April 8, 2022 and continuing due to damages and losses caused by Bovine Tuberculosis (Bovine TB).

Application Deadline: May 26, 2023

Primary Counties Eligible: Maui
