Federal Emergency Management Agency Designates Pike County, Pennsylvania, as Contiguous Natural Disaster Area

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Primary Natural Disaster Areas located in New York

This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: New York

Triggering Disaster: Severe Storms and Flooding that occurred from 07/09/2023 to 07/10/2023

Application Deadline: 03/22/2024

Primary Counties Eligible: Clinton, Dutchess, Essex, Hamilton, Ontario, Orange, Putnam, Rockland

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

New York: Columbia, Franklin, Fulton, Herkimer, Livingston, Monroe, St. Lawrence, Saratoga, Seneca, Steuben, Sullivan, Ulster, Warren, Washington, Wayne, Westchester, Yates

Connecticut: Fairfield, Litchfield

Massachusetts: Berkshire

New Jersey: Bergen, Passaic, Sussex

Pennsylvania: Pike

Vermont: Addison, Chittenden, Grand Isle
