Portland, OR, July 27, 2023 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is opening 17 new Urban Service Centers in the next year including one in Portland and investing in new partnerships to support urban agriculture.

"Providing urban agricultural producers with the same level of support as all farmers and ranchers is key to equitable USDA assistance," said Gail Greenman, Farm Service Agency (FSA) State Executive Director in Oregon. "Through local level partnerships, USDA will learn how to expand our networks, infrastructure and services to urban producers as they strengthen resilient local food systems and nutrition access for all communities."

Urban Service Centers

The Urban Service Centers will be staffed by FSA and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) employees and will offer farm loan, conservation, disaster assistance and risk management programs. USDA works with agricultural producers through a network of more than 2,300 Service Centers nationwide and the new Urban Service Centers will strengthen services to urban agricultural producers.

"Every producer deserves USDA support in their own community, whether that community is in an urban or rural setting," Said Ron Alvarado, NRCS State Conservationist in Oregon, "We encourage people in urban communities to connect with us and learn what programs and services we have to meet their unique needs."

Urban Service Centers are also home to Urban County Committees, which help with the local administration of FSA programs. FSA is accepting nominations until August 1, 2023, for county committee members for elections that will occur later this year.

The Urban Service Center is located at Clackamas County & Portland Urban FSA Office, 22055 S. Beavercreek Rd. Suite 2 Beavercreek, OR 97004. Team members include Amanda Welker, CED.

Support for Urban Agriculture

To help strengthen Urban Service Centers and Urban County Committees, USDA is investing American Rescue Plan funds into partnerships with community-based organizations. This is part of USDA's broad support for urban agriculture and innovative production.

FSA has awarded cooperative agreements to organizations located in cities where USDA is opening Urban Service Centers or will have an urban county committee, including Ecotrust in Portland through outreach, engagement, education, research and technical assistance, Ecotrust, and other community-based organizations and stakeholders, will work to improve the coordination and effectiveness of USDA programs and services for urban and innovative producers and help mitigate economic disruptions by funding projects designed to increase equity in urban food systems.

The new cooperative agreements and Urban Service Center is part of USDA's broader USDA investment in urban agriculture in Portland. Other efforts include:

- <u>Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production competitive grants</u>, including one to Community
 Development Corporation of Oregon to provide farm mentoring, business training, development
 of successful entrepreneurial projects, and distribution of healthy, fresh, and culturally
 appropriate food in low income and low food access areas which will serve immigrant and
 refugee communities.
- Partnering with Our Village Garden to grow the People's Garden initiative.
