



USDA Designates Five Kentucky Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Kentucky

Triggering Disaster: Flash Flood, Hail, High Winds, Lightning

Application Deadline: 5/7/2024

Primary Counties Eligible: Madison

Triggering Disaster 2: Flash Flood and Excessive Rain

Application Deadline: 5/7/2024

Kentucky: Breckinridge, Butler, Daviess, Grayson, Hancock, Henderson, Hopkins, Muhlenberg, Webster

Triggering Disaster 3: Flash Floods

Application Deadline: 5/7/2024

Primary Counties Eligible: McCracken

Kentucky: Ballard, Carlisle, Graves, Livingston, Marshall

Illinois: Massac, Pulaski

Triggering Disaster 4: Excessive Rains, Flash Floods, High Winds, Hail, and Lightning

Application Deadline: 5/7/2024

Primary Counties Eligible: Calloway

Kentucky: Graves, Marshall, Trigg

Tennessee: Henry, Stewart
