USDA Designates 9 Wyoming Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Wyoming

Triggering Disaster: Excessive Snow, High Winds, and Freezing Conditions

Application Deadline: November 29, 2023

Primary Counties Eligible: Albany, Carbon, Converse, Fremont, Johnson, Natrona, Sheridan, Sweetwater, and Uinta

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Wyoming: Big Horn, Campbell, Hot Springs, Laramie, Lincoln, Niobrara, Park, Platte, Sublette, Teton, Washakie, and Weston

Colorado: Jackson, Larimer, Moffat, and Routt

Montana: Big Horn and Powder River

Utah: Daggett, Rich, and Summit
