USDA Designates Four New York Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: New York

Triggering Disaster: Flash Flooding and Excessive Rain

Application Deadline: 7/3/2024

Primary Counties Eligible: Ontario, Ulster, Dutchess, Putnam

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

New York: Monroe, Wayne, Livingston, Seneca, Yates, Steuben, Delaware, Sullivan, Orange,

Westchester, Rockland, Columbia, Greene

Connecticut: Fairfield, Litchfield

Massachusetts: Berkshire
