Missouri Disaster Designation Impacts Four Iowa Counties

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A Secretarial Disaster Designation has been issued for 10 counties in Missouri as primary disaster areas due to drought. Additionally, four (4) lowa counties are contiguous to the disaster area. This determination will allow the Farm Service Agency's Emergency Loans to be made available to eligible family farmers with qualifying production and physical losses in the primary and the contiguous counties to the declared disaster area.

Secretarial Declaration Number: S5426

Emergency Loan Application Deadline: February 5, 2024

Primary Counties Eligible: Primary counties located in Missouri

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Appanoose, Davis, Lee, Van Buren (Iowa) Disaster Description: Drought. May 30, 2023, beginning date of incident period.
